Job title:

Abbey Church Cleaner.

Hours of Work:

20 hrs per week, carried out on Saturdays plus 4 week days.

Rate of pay:

£6.49 per hour.

Main purpose of job:

To keep all the Church premises in a clean and tidy condition, fit for use by our congregation and to a standard acceptable to the Congregational Committee.

Relationships:

The Church cleaner will carry out such duties as the Minister and/or Congregational Secretary shall direct and be responsible to these two persons or to such persons as the Congregational Committee may nominate.

Main tasks of job:

- Be a primary key holder for the premises.
- Floor cleaning including washing, stripping off old polish, polishing, brushing and vacuuming
- Dusting surfaces
- Cleaning stairwells
- Cleaning glass doors mirrors and chairs
- Full hygiene of kitchen, toilets and bins
- Maintain clean towels and dishcloths where needed throughout the building
- Ensure that cleaning and toiletry materials are adequately stocked, and when necessary purchase replacements, to agreed limits, on behalf of the Church.

The above is not an exhaustive list of duties and the cleaner will be expected to perform different tasks as necessitated by the role within the Church and the overall requirement of the Church.
